A WORD FROM SENIOR PASTOR CHRISTOPHER CHIA

Dear Friends, what is your consuming passion of life?

Some of us are consumed by preoccupations - spanning from studies, careers to money. Others are consumed by emotions - stretching from anxiety, bitterness to unforgiveness. Many of us are increasingly consumed by digital addiction.

The Apostle Paul had one consuming passion: “He is the one we proclaim, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, **so that we may present everyone fully mature in Christ.** To this end I strenuously contend with all the energy Christ so powerfully works in me.”

Paul’s consuming passion was to convert and present everyone fully mature in Christ. Every year brings new opportunities for fresh encounters to be consumed and conformed to maturity to be like Jesus, who alone offers us eternal life by reversing our death.

2025 will be a historic year. The building is finally complete! Our gospel mission has begun! We are located at Bukit Batok West Ave 5 but our mission field is the spanking new HDB estate of Tengah, which will have 40,000 residents.

By God’s grace, we are the first kid on the block!

Again, the Apostle Paul stated his passion to share Christ this way: **“For we do not want to boast about work already done in someone else’s territory.” (2 Corinthians 10:16).** Many so-called church plants today are sadly church supplanters of others’ ministries.

ARPC has no such intentions.

We will only go where God wants to go. **We will focus on planting Christ in people’s hearts and maturing people spiritually in Christ,** rather than planting numerically or geographically.

Our annual ARPC Handbook gives us a snapshot of the God we believe in and how we live to fulfil Jesus’ Great Commission and his Great Commandment to love another as witnesses to his sacrificial love. Read on.

The 2023–2027 theme of our denomination: Strengthening Faith and Family in a Digital Age

1. Strengthening Faith and Family in Community

2025 is also historic as we celebrate Singapore’s 60th year of Independence. It is SG60! In God’s time, it also marks the extension of God’s mission through His One Church in Three Places with the launch of ARPC@Tengah.

We pray to keep sharing Christ with our community and country.

From our present outreach - through our Prisons & Drug Rehab (BASK), school chaplaincy, Migrant Workers/Adopt A Dorm (AAD), St Luke’s ElderCare partnership, Marketplace Talks, Mental Wellness - to new platforms at Tengah (from Tuition, Active Aging, At Risk kids, Family ministries to Community Games).



The highlight will be our **Let's Carnival Together SG60**. We pray that President Tharman* will grace the occasion as we partner President's Challenge to raise volunteerism and funds to help with the disadvantaged through the arts and sports. (* Saturday, August 2. TBC)

2. Strengthening Faith and Family in Church

a. Maturing in God's Word

The firm foundation of our saving faith is God's Word fulfilled in Christ. ARPC is from first to last a Bible-centred church. So, in 2025, we will learn from two Old and two New Testament books: **Matthew's Gospel, James, Ecclesiastes and Isaiah**. We will have topical series on major doctrines.

b. Church Camp 2025: The Holy Spirit

Our Church Camp in Malaysia will be an All-Age Bonanza. We will have **Colin Buchanan** minister to our children while **Phillip Jensen*** (TBC) will teach on the Holy Spirit. How can we be clear about the Spirit's work for God's mission? Come for a spiritual Feast!

3. Strengthening Faith and Family through ALL Seasons

ARPC is committed to discipling our people through all seasons - from birth to bereavement. We are a church for Everyone - from students, ex-prisoners, graduates to professionals. We are an inter-generational church seeking to bless kids, youth, singles, families and elderly. **Our Spiritual Family-centric Ministry** seeks to dovetail and focus on taking personal, marriage and family discipleship seriously.

a. Children's Church (CC)

We started with 2 kids in 1991. God has now blessed us with about 1000 from babies to 12 years. We run CC for babies, toddlers, preschool (3-5) to primary (7-12).

b. Marriage Preparation Retreats (MPRs)

We started with a handful of couples. Since 1991, we have helped to equip dating couples and conducted more than 500 weddings.

c. Marriage Enrichment Retreats (MERs)

We have trained about 20 Marriage Mentors to grow this ministry. We encourage all couples to make MERs a “must”!

d. Annual Family Conferences (FCs)

We will partner with national efforts to strengthen families, the highlight will be National Family Festival Month. This year, there will be special focus on **Parenting Together SG 60** through all seasons. Come for these life-changing FCs (**Feb 8-9, TBC**)



4. Strengthened to Bless Churches of Singapore

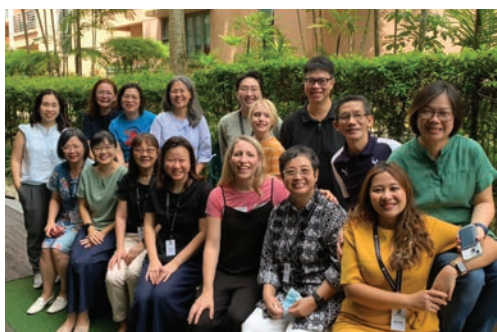
a. Word Partnerships: Ligonier Bible Conference

c. Word & Worship Partnerships

God has used ARPC to bless the wider Singapore church with models and songs for worship at home and in church. The Gettys, Jordan Kauflin and Laura Story have come to bless us. In 2025, we will be partnering Redemption Hill Church and Barker Road Methodist Church again to host CityALight on **Saturday, July 12**.

Where it all began!

God has blessed ARPC@Adam to grow from about 60 adults and two children to 2,000 adults and 1,000 kids today.

ARPC@Adam is the original “Commuting Church”. People come from all over Singapore to worship with us.

ARPC@Adam will continue to stand out as “the most central church”, being located smack in the middle of Singapore. We regularly have about 1,100 in 3 Services.

ARPC@BISHAN

Where we first expanded

God blessed us to be the Anchor church to Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Secondary School (KCPSS).

ARPC@Bishan was the LAST kid on the block in the established HDB estate of Bishan.

We sent about 400 people out of 1,200 at Adam to start this work. We regularly have about 800 in Sunday Services.

ARPC@TENGAH

Where God is blessing us

with a third site to continue to grow His kingdom by “Proclamation” and “Demonstration” of the gospel.

We will be the FIRST kid on the block in Singapore’s newest HDB estate, Tengah.

We pray to send about 600 people to start this work and pray for it to grow by the same faithful preaching of God’s Word, the making of disciples and the community outreaches to a new estate.

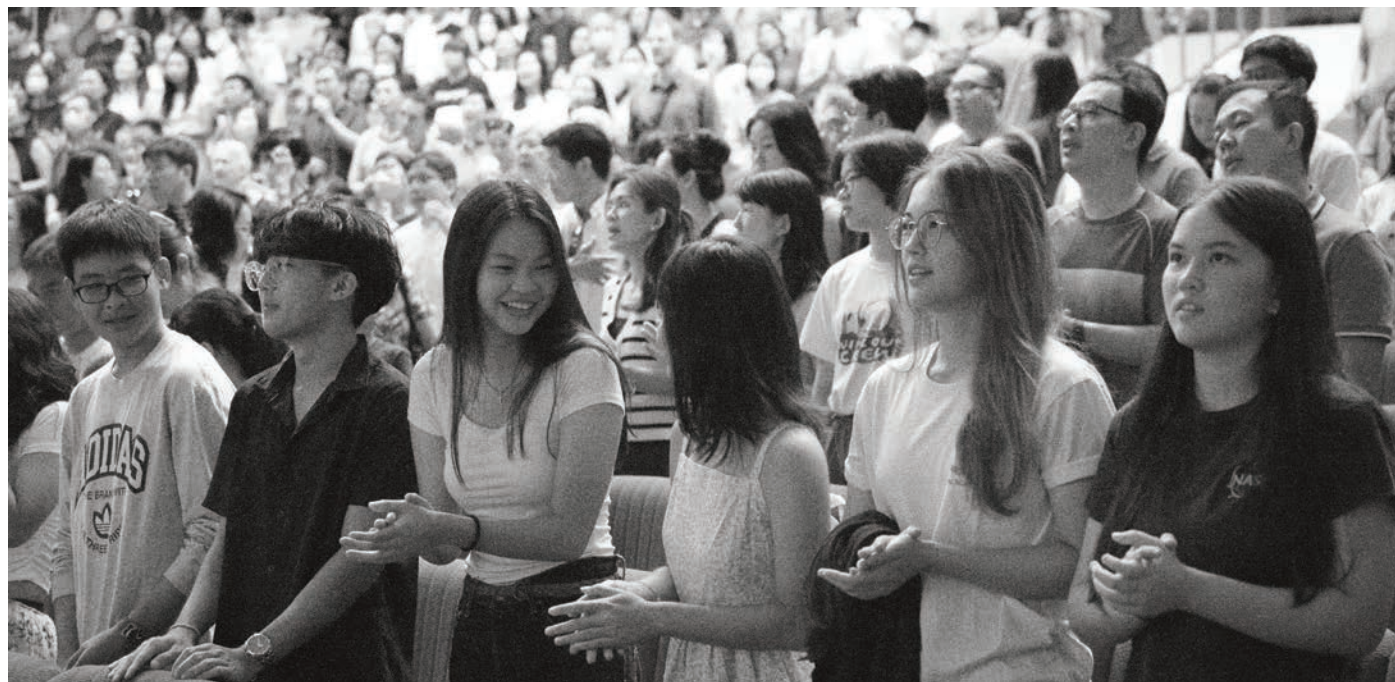

WHO WE ARE UNDER GOD



What kind of church is ARPC? Yes, we are Reformed. Yes, we are Evangelical. What are we “on” about? We are on about GOD—His name, kingdom and will. More precisely, we are on about JESUS. God has put the world on notice: It is now under Jesus’ new management! This is ARPC’s loftiest concern: To be Christ-like people!

1. ARPC is a Gospel-centred & Bible-centred church

We take the gospel full-heartedly by taking God’s Word seriously as the supreme authority in all matters of faith and conduct. We are committed to:

- Expository Preaching that explains the full counsel of God not simply on Sundays but every day in all our ministries—from children to adults, from prisons to university work and from Services to small groups.
- Biblical Theology that explains God’s salvation story foretold in the Old Testament and fulfilled in the person of Jesus Christ. This keeps us from misrepresenting Christianity as mere religion, moralism or legalism. Christianity is having a right relationship with God as our Father and Jesus our Saviour and Lord.
- Discipling God’s people to follow Jesus and love God by knowing, teaching and living God’s Word. Each week, about 300 of our leaders teach the Bible faithfully in big groups, small groups and one-to-one to our 1,000 children, 350 youth and 2,000 adults.
- Being a Bible-centred and Spirit-filled people as there is no dichotomy of Word versus Spirit in God’s saving mission.

2. ARPC seeks not simply to be Christ-centred but to be Christ-like

We believe in teaching our people for maturity. All our programmes are to equip our people to “Tell of Jesus” and “Become like Jesus” in His love, servant-heartedness and humility. Our Discipleship Groups, Leaders Training, Annual Camps, Equip Conferences and Ministry Apprentice Program are to equip God’s people to grow to Christ-like humility and maturity.

3. ARPC seeks to be a humble God-glorifying church

We believe in Bible literacy for Christ-like maturity. It is Christ-likeness that glorifies God. Yes, we are committed to the Word of God but we more concerned to worship our God of Word.

We are “all-size”, “all-age” and “all place”. “All-size” church? God made us with both a personal yet communal side. We can be part of big gatherings, belong to a small group yet enjoy personal ministries. “All-age” church? God made us to love both old and young! “All-place” church? God meant the church to be local, yet global in its reach. At ARPC, we are an “all-size”, “all-age” and “all-place” family of God! We believe that we can “grow bigger, yet grow closer” simultaneously.

We delight in helping people and churches grow in these gospel DNAs.

Last but not least, we are a Praying People who walk by God’s Spirit.

MARKS OF GOD'S LEADERS AND HIS PEOPLE

WHAT GOD EXPECTS OF HIS CHURCH



7 Marks of Godly Leadership

1. Leaders, and their wives, must have a good reputation and not dishonour God (*1 Tim 3*).
2. Married leaders must be faithful and be able to manage their households (*1 Tim 3*).
3. Leaders should make Godly decisions which edify the body and evangelise unbelievers (*Acts 6*).
4. Leaders must discharge duties willingly as selfless shepherds, not as self-interested hirelings (*1 Peter 5*).
5. Leaders must walk the talk (*Acts 20:28, 1 Thess 2:8, 1 Tim 3:10, 2 Tim 2:2, 2 Tim 3:10–11*).
6. Leaders must NOT be proud (*1 Tim 3, 1 Peter 5*).
7. Leaders must NOT be quarrelsome (*1 Tim 6:3, 2 Tim 2:24*).

7 Marks of God's People

1. No part of the body of Christ should think and act in isolation.
2. No part of the body of Christ should think and act in superiority.
3. No part of the body of Christ should think and act in deception (*Eph 4:25*).
4. All parts of the body of Christ should think and act in love (*1 Cor 13*).
5. All parts of the body of Christ should think and act in unity (*Rom 15:5–7, Phil 2:1–2*).
6. The “strong” parts of the body of Christ should put love before liberty (*Romans 15:1*).
7. The “weak” parts of the body of Christ should put principle before compromise.

7 Marks of Godly Fellowship

1. Leaders are worthy of double honour (*1 Tim 5:17*).
2. Do NOT accuse your leaders lightly (*1 Tim 5:19*).
3. Do NOT demonise nor idolise your leaders. Remember your leaders' teaching and life (*Hebrews 13:7*).
4. Obey you leaders and submit to their authority (*Hebrews 13:17*).
5. Do NOT be ashamed of your Godly leaders through thick and thin (*2 Tim 1:8, Hebrews 10:33–34*).
6. Pray for your leaders (*Eph 6:19, 1 Thess 5:25*).
7. Both leaders and followers should live up to the purity and unity we have in Christ.

We are a spiritual home to many "**returnee**" **students** graduating from Australia, UK, USA and around the globe. Many have made the important transition from "being equipped in campus" to "serving in the local church". Come and join us!

Locally, our enduring partners have ranged from **our Presbyterian churches, OMF, SIM, WEC, Prisons and Drug Rehabilitation Work, to the Boys' and Girls' Brigades (BB & GB), Singapore Bible College (SBC), and**

Trinity Theological College (TTC). We seek to humbly continue these ties.

MINISTRY APPRENTICE PROGRAM

TRAINING FUTURE LEADERS TODAY

There is a growing need for Christian workers as the Gospel goes forth to the ends of the earth. ARPC wants to be committed to God's Great Commission.



The Ministry Apprentice Program (MAP) is our training program to identify and train potential people suitable for Christian ministry. MAP will focus on the three essentials of character, knowledge and skills (CKS).

Through the three stages in MAP, our prayer is to produce Godly Christian men and women to serve as

Pastors, Missionaries and Leaders in ARPC, Singapore and beyond.

Our prayerful task is to produce trained men and women for a lifelong ministry of Bible teaching, gospel preaching and Christ-like living.

Step 1: MAP Staff Workers

Suitable candidates will be encouraged to enter into a two-year hands-on and full-paying training programme with ARPC. This is to expose them to the rigours and realities of full-time Christian work as they teach the Bible, relate to people and grow in Godliness.

Step 2: MAP Associates

Suitable Staff Workers may be supported for full-time theological training with the goal of serving ARPC, Singapore and beyond.

Step 3: Full-Time Ministers of the Gospel

MAP Associates supported by ARPC will either join the ARPC Pastoral Team or be encouraged to serve outside ARPC.

Depending on the suitability of the candidate, the needs of the church and circumstances, the pastors and leaders will prayerfully guide the candidate to the next ministry.

OUR COMMUNITY, PRISONS & SCHOOLS MINISTRY

SERVING SINGAPORE, CHANGING LIVES



ARPC is a Reformed and Evangelical church. We are committed to the Proclamation and Demonstration of Jesus' love for God's world.

In 2015, 2017, 2019 and 2023 we hosted Let's Carnival! By God's grace, unknown to us, this became the largest event for the President's Challenge Volunteer Drive. In Singapore's Jubilee Year in 2015, we blessed 350 beneficiaries from nine charities and 200 needy residents.

In land-scarce Singapore, churches increasingly need to show how we are benefitting society for us to retain our precious leasehold premises for worship and ministry. Our Let's Carnival initiative is but the tip of ARPC's long but understated history of blessing our community and the needy.

In the mid-1980s: We provided free tuition to students in Woodlands and Lakeview.

In 1993: Pastor Christopher Chia began preaching at The Helping Hand, a Christian drug halfway house, and ARPC started hosting ex-addicts. He continued a lifetime legacy of prison work by Pastor John Ting.

Today: ARPC's **Prison Ministry under Pastor Jeffrey Quek** reaches five blocks of Changi Prison weekly.

We host a number of **BB and GB companies** to build character in our youth.

2015: We became the anchor church to **Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Secondary School (KCPSS)**. We are overjoyed to be partners with teachers, students and parents

to value-add in raising generation after generation of responsible citizens.

We pray ARPC will be a church that both meets in a school and ministers to our school. Our role is to contribute in every way—financially, spiritually and practically—to the well-being of our schools and students.

As the residential Anchor Church to Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Secondary School (KCPSS), our ministry ranges from morning devotions, chapel talks, recess work, counseling to after-school activities.

So, as God's people, we want to send this message to our neighbours and nation: We are here to bless you as God's people.



MISSIONS MINISTRY



ARPC's vision is to see every member become BOTH a "goer" (one who is involved in cross-cultural mission work) AND a "sender" (one who sends and supports "goers"), participating in God's Mission from anywhere to everywhere.

In today's globalised world, God's people have the opportunities to reach out to those who have not yet heard the gospel, from those who have arrived on our shores to those who are geographically far away.

The ARPC Missions Ministry thus mobilises and sustains God's people to carry out His mission wherever he places them (Acts 17:26). We raise awareness and exposure to cross-cultural missions at ARPC through:

- Short-term mission trips for DGs to participate in God's work in another culture, either overseas (to refugees in Malaysia, slum village in Cambodia, mountain tribes in Thailand, city folk in Japan) or locally (such as the migrant workers, domestic helpers and international students etc)
- Missions Retreat to strengthen our passion for and deepen our knowledge of God's mission.
- Mentoring programs to journey with those who are currently involved in missions, as well as exploring doing missions either as missionaries or tentmakers (i.e. being involved in missions while working overseas)

Currently, ARPC is involved in countries where such as Japan, Cambodia, Thailand and Indonesia. Whether you are considering going on a mission trip with your DG or journeying with ARPC in missions, contact us. We are ready to serve you!

ADOPT A DORM MINISTRY



God opened the door for ARPC to be part of the outreach to migrant workers. The pandemic highlighted the plight, housing needs and social isolation of 400,000 workers here.

The Adopt A Dorm (AAD) Ministry was formed in 2020 by Pastors Christopher Chia and Lim Luck Yong to help our migrant workers in Singapore. This was our expression of loving the foreigners among us, as God desires His people to do. As part of improving their mental wellness, ARPC's AAD team delivered care packages during the pandemic, and collaborated with the Ministry of Manpower (MOM) to bring them to tourist attractions where the workers have never been able to afford to go, including Cable Car rides to Sentosa, Gardens By The Bay and the SEA Aquarium.

Since the end of the pandemic, the AAD ministry team has been pivoting to meet the needs of the migrant workers. We thank God that in 2024, we started collaborating with the Migrant Workers Centre to help befriend the workers here. The long working hours of our migrant friends are very real, and many have been living apart from their families for many years. Do pray for us to have the wisdom to address their needs while showing them the love of our compassionate God.

INTERNATIONAL NURSING STUDENT MINISTRY

Every year, a few hundred young adults from neighbouring countries are offered scholarships to study nursing at our local polytechnics. After their studies, they are bonded to local hospitals for six years as staff nurses.

In 2023, God opened the door for ARPC to reach out to these nursing students. God also moved the hearts of befrienders/hosts from ARPC to extend hospitality to these foreigners. We are focusing on those from people groups that do not have much access to the gospel in their homeland.

We engage these students through:

- Quarterly events
- Small group hangouts
- Interest groups
- Host Family Programme

We are looking to have more "host families" (either spouses, biological or spiritual families/DGs) to invite students to meals, introduce Singaporean culture, offer support and extend hospitality, at least once a month. We are also looking for prayer warriors to pray for the ministry once a month.

Since these students come from a different culture, it is essential for us to understand their cultural background. To address this, we offer cross-cultural training sessions. We recognise that this opportunity may not always be available to us, so we are eager to make the most of it while we can.

And we are here to welcome you as His people! We pray you will find here **a loving international and inter-generational community** that lives out our unity in Christ.

Your first step begins with Newcomers Desk, then Steps 1, 2 and 3: Newcomers' Meal, Just for Newcomers (including Discovering Christianity) and Class ARPC.

STEP 1: COME TO THE NEWCOMERS MEAL

We come to know you. You come to know us. Together, we grow to know God. Newcomers are invited to a free meal. Second Sunday of the month (1:30pm) at the Manse (Pastor Christopher Chia's residence). The Manse is located at ARPC@Adam (adjacent to the playground).

Crèche

Crèche is a space for babies (0-18 months) to experience their first introduction to church, offering a comfortable environment for both babies and mothers. Parents can attend services in the sanctuary or via audio-visual feed. While there is no formal teaching program, babies are exposed to the Bible, and Crèche leaders pray for and support families. Those interested in serving families are encouraged to join the Crèche ministry.

Toddlers

The Toddlers Ministry at ARPC has been active since 1999, responding to the growing number of children in the church. The program includes toys, songs with actions, Bible stories, and crafts, all based on the Hands-On Bible Curriculum and Teaching Little Ones, adapted by experienced leaders. The ministry engages children through their five senses to make God’s Word real and tangible. Parents often share how their toddlers sing songs or repeat Bible messages at home, highlighting the program’s impact.

Pre-School and Primary

Our weekly services include group worship with songs and prayers, along with small group classes for different age groups. We promote Bible familiarity through memory verses and a two-year Catechism series for preschoolers. Preschool programs are supplemented by the Teaching Little Ones curriculum, while primary programs align with the Adult Preaching Series. Special events like missions, camps, and other programs are held throughout the year to complement the teaching and enhance learning.

Teaching Programmes for CC groups as follow:

Crèche & Toddlers’ Group

The Crèche does not have a formal teaching programme but children under 18 months are left there for social interaction and for leaders to support parents in building strong partnership with church from infancy.

The Toddlers’ Group follows the Hands-On Bible Curriculum, which makes gospel learning tangible by using common objects.



Pre-School Age Groups

“Learning About God”(LG), a syllabus that begins with foundational truths about God—God made, God loves and God knows—and introduces the Bible, prayer, and God’s son, Jesus.

“Promises” (P), which covers how God makes promises in a covenantal relationship with His people, the Israelites, and now with all who believe in His Son.

“Kingship” (K), which looks at kings in the Old Testament, and how some obeyed and others disobeyed Him. The lessons focus on King Saul, King David and King Solomon.

“Salvation” (S), which helps children to relate to what it means to be a people saved by God and how salvation is related.

Special topics on Celebrating God’s Good Design (Special Needs, Biblical Manhood & Womanhood), Easter (Evangelism). Mission and Creation Care are also included through the special events.

Primary Age Groups

The Primary children are taught the same Bible books as the adult congregation. This facilitates discussion and reinforcement within families. In 2025, we will be covering The Gospel of Matthew 5-12, Ecclesiastes, James and Isaiah. In addition, we will have Missions Month in September to partner with our missionaries or missions agencies.

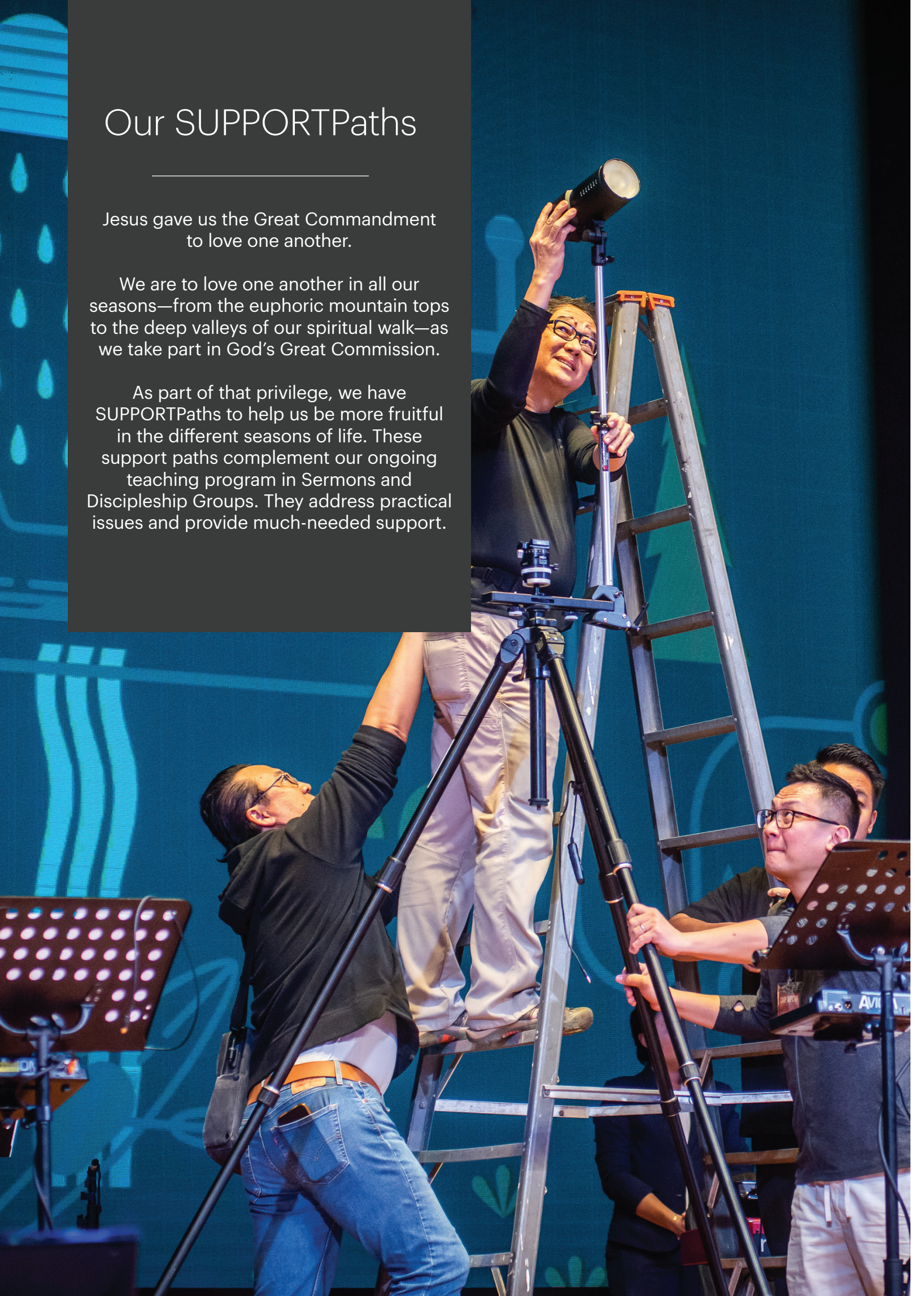

Our SUPPORTPaths

As part of that privilege, we have SUPPORTPaths to help us be more fruitful in the different seasons of life. These support paths complement our ongoing teaching program in Sermons and Discipleship Groups. They address practical issues and provide much-needed support.



MERCY MINISTRY

“Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven.” — Luke 6:36-37



Think of Visitation and Cancer Support. Think of Bereavement and Prisons Ministries. Think of love and mercy extended to the marginalised. This is the Mercy Ministry.

Mercy is at the heart of God’s character. Being made anew in Christ does not mean that we neither struggle with sin nor are we sinless. We are now beloved children of God only through atonement by Christ’s blood.

We live to showcase God’s gospel. Just as God showed us mercy through His Son, we too now extend His mercy to others. We do not strive to be their saviours. But through acts of mercy, we point them to the only true Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

ARPC’s outreach of mercy dates back to the 1990s when Pastor Christopher Chia ministered at The Helping Hand.

In 2009, Prison Fellowship Singapore invited the church to partner them in providing In-Care for in-mates. This work later extended to Aftercare Fellowship (Brothers And Sisters’ Keepers – BASK). Since 2009, God has grown the Mercy Ministry to include the Bereavement, Cancer Support, Visitation and Prisons (In-care and Aftercare) ministries. In 2014, a women’s team also started ministering in Changi Women’s Prison.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY

Women make up more than half of the church and it is extremely important to support each other as sisters, daughters, wives, mothers, widows and grandmothers to encourage each other to maturity in the Lord Jesus.

Among the Women's Fellowship events, Bible study groups and support groups, ongoing social encounters enrich the lives of women here in ARPC, both single and married. Our primary aim is to complement men as we grow and mature together as the body of Christ.

Homemakers Discipleship Groups in Adam Road, Sengkang and Toa Payoh-Bishan continue to meet as small group fellowship. Our Mums and Babes (or Bubs) formerly the Pray and Play support group runs every fortnight, working through a marriage or parenting book which helps with their roles as wives and mums. A schedule of their fortnightly meetings is available.

Key women leaders play a pivotal role to lead and plan activities for the big groups or on a one-to-one discipleship journey or through counselling and mentoring sessions.

Training events are planned each year for the wider body of women to equip, empower and evangelise those whom we are influencing as followers and disciples of Christ, e.g. Laura Story conference and concert. The fellowship and training events are announced through the bulletin.

BOYS' & GIRLS' BRIGADES

OUR CHRISTIAN-BASED UNIFORM GROUPS



The Boys' Brigade (BB) and The Girls' Brigade (GB) are Christian-based uniformed youth organisations which operate in local schools as Co-Curricular Activities (CCA). ARPC sponsors 4 BB Companies (5th, 34th, 42nd & 66th) and 2 GB Companies (12th & 28th) in four schools in Woodlands (Marsiling Secondary and Woodlands Secondary Schools), Bukit Timah (Nanyang Primary School) and Bishan (Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Secondary School). Total number of the Boys & Girls is 150.

The Boys & Girls come from a wide spectrum of the society. There are some from who travels daily from Johor Bahru to attend school here. There are those whose parents work long hours and students return to an empty home. There are also those who come from a dysfunctional family where their differences becomes a barrier. However, one common denominator which cut across this wide spectrum is love.

Each Boy or Girl is an individual created in God's image who needs to be redeemed by God. BBGB, for many of them, is their first encounter with Christianity. Through BBGB Ministry, they get to hear the Good News

proclaimed. 80% of the students are non-believers. They are captive audience for a good 4 to 5 years with us. Through these 4 to 5 years, we want to seize every opportunity to teach them who God is & the difference He makes in our life.

The Good News of our Lord Christ is also shared through our teaching and modelling of our lives. There are tremendous opportunity to share the good news to 80% of the students. Many of them lack a role model and we play a key role in providing godly role model in their life.

ARPC members/regulars serve as Officers and helpers to reach out to the Boys and Girls. Each adult co-worker is the conduit and channel for God's love to flow through to the Boys and Girls. We provide fun, meaningful and challenging activities like Christian Education, Leadership Development, Community Service and Global Awareness. Through our weekly interaction with the youths, we build relationships with them, love them and provide guidance and mentorship to nurture them in character and skills.

DEAF & HARD OF HEARING MINISTRY

THE GOSPEL THROUGH SIGN LANGUAGE

The deaf community and people with hearing loss go through life isolated from the hearing world due to a lack of information which is accessed through the faculty of hearing. The deaf community needs Christians who know sign language to tell them about Jesus.

The Deaf & Hard of Hearing Ministry (DHHM) aims to create an awareness of Sign language as a cultural bridge for communication. This aids evangelism, mission and song-signing music that is felt, seen and experienced as a concept through Sign language.

We want to serve the deaf and the hard of hearing by providing Sign language interpretation at our 9 am Sunday service at ARPC@Adam, as well as transcribing service to ARPC seniors who are experiencing hearing loss due to age degeneration.

A weekly Bible study/fellowship for the deaf and the hard of hearing is held in Sengkang, ARPC@Adam or via zoom. The ministry continues to reach out to the deaf community through various ways and means.

The ministry continues to train committed Christians to serve as transcribers for Sunday service or as signers for Bible Study, and song-signers for worship, and also for home/hospital visitation.

The Bible tells us in Romans 10:14-15, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach good news!"

DHHM seeks to communicate the gospel articulately so that the faith of the deaf and hard of hearing will be well grounded.

OUR WORSHIP, SINGING & MUSIC

GLORIFYING GOD WITH LIFE WORSHIP



Worship, music and singing are much misunderstood today. So we need to be clear about these because they all affect our walk with God.

Worship in the New Testament centres around Jesus. Matthew 12:6 states that “one greater than the temple is here.” This means that the new meeting point between God and man is not centred around a place but a person—the person of the Risen Lord Jesus!

The Lord Christ Jesus alone is the Worship Leader who brings us into God’s presence! We cannot get any closer or be any more right with God than through Jesus (*Hebrews 10:19–25*). **Worship is everything God does for us in Christ, not anything we do to be acceptable to God.**

The fundamental act of worship is submission and homage to Jesus as Lord and Saviour. The right response to Christ is **life worship**, not simply “live” music worship.

In *Romans*, our **life worship** includes prayer (1:9–10), submission to God-given authorities (13:1–7), love for one another in the body (12:3–13), living out the unity of the gospel (15:5–7), support of God’s people (15:25–30).

We do not “enter” into worship by our prayers, rituals and songs. None of these gets us any closer or makes us more right with God. This means that sharing the Good News is the way to bring people to submit and pay homage to God and Christ.

So why do we sing and play music? Why we sing is part of a bigger question: “Why do we meet as God’s people?” *Colossians 3:16* instructs us to allow God’s Word to dwell in us as we “sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs” with gratitude in our hearts to God. Indeed, *Ephesians 5:18* tell us that singing “God songs” is one expression of what it means to be continually filled with God’s Spirit. What does all this mean?

1. **We should be concerned about Christian lyrics, not Christian music.** This should free us to praise God with different types of music—hymns, choruses, Negro spirituals, Asian melodies—as long as the words are Scripture or Scriptural in meaning.
2. Our singing has both **a vertical focus on God and a horizontal focus on one another.** We should sing songs—about God and to God—as we sing to spur one another on.
3. **Emotions vs Emotionalism.** There is a difference between using music for emotionalism and feeling emotional while stirred by hearing the Gospel in song. Our singing of gospel songs may evoke emotions as part of the total life response of faith in Christ, love for the saints and hope in heaven. Singing alone is not worship but life worship in the Spirit should include worshipful singing (*Eph 5:18, Col 3:16*)!

We should avoid extremes. We should not end up as “songless” Christians because we are reacting to bad theology and practices around us. Rather, Christians are the only ones to have every reason to sing with all our heart to God and one another of the great God who loves us enough to save us! We aspire to be a church which sings distinctively Christian songs—and sings full heartedly—to God’s glory!

Come and join us! Indeed, why not be part of our heartfelt and tuneful music ministry? We can always do with more musicians and singers to build up the body of Christ with love!

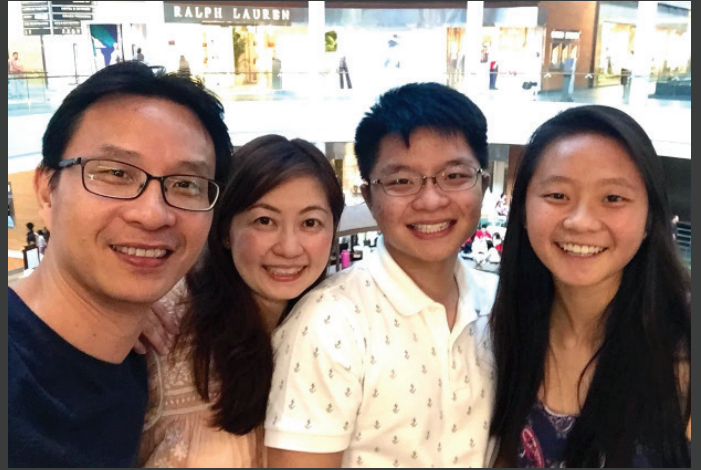
