A Pastoral Letter on COVID-19 (15 May 2021)

Preventing premature victories:

Go early, go hard, go together, go the distance

Latest Updates:

Dear ARPC family & friends, we praise God for guiding us step by step. We suspended our onsite Services & ministries last week. We will be extending this suspension of our onsite Services & ministries and moving them online until June 13. Weddings, which have been planned in May & June, can proceed as per the latest guidelines. This is to comply with the heightened measures yet go the extra mile to do our part to help overcome this latest resurgence. Please join us online!

1. The Global and Local COVID-19 Situation

Countries are experiencing a resurgence of cases and the emergence of new virus variants. Locally transmitted and unlinked community cases have also stubbornly continued to spike. These signal undetected community transmissions that could rapidly escalate into another major outbreak. Added to this is what we do not know: the efficacy of available vaccines to the variants.

2. Our National Response

Our government is rightly taking decisive action to curb infections and to tighten safe management measures to reduce the risk of community spread in this period of heightened alert. It is of utmost national importance that everyone be extra vigilant and take all necessary precautions against the spread. The spirit of this “whole of nation” approach takes us back to Phase 2 and is to prevent a return to lockdown like the circuit breaker.

3. ARPC’s Response & Responsibility

As Christians, we have a dual responsibility to be good witnesses on earth while enroute to our true home in heaven (1 Peter 2:9-25).
